GCHS Capital Campaign – New Building Fast Facts

About the Campaign:

- GCHS hopes to raise 850,000 to build a long-term care facility
- Green County generously donated 8.5 acres for the building at the Pleasant View Complex on a 99-year, \$1-a-year lease
- The operating budget will also increase, raising the need for donations year round
- Large donors, businesses, citizens and an active “Kid Corps” are already donating, half the money has already been pledged or donated!

The Vision:

- Ability to grow as our community grows
- Capacity to shelter more animals in need (66 dog runs, 175 cat runs, versus the cramped 37 dog kennels and 150 cat kennels at the current facility)
- Easy-to-maintain, well-insulated metal building with solar lighting for cost savings
- Easy to clean sanitary surfaces and kennels
- In-floor heat for animal and human comfort
- On-site spay and neuter services and vet care room
- Night drop-offs for law enforcement
- A multi-purpose room for animal training and community education
- Meet and greet rooms for potential adopters
- Goal to also accept pet surrenders

About GCHS and its Citizens:

- Founded in 1978 as a 501(c)3 organization
- A no-kill shelter that takes in 500+ strays and special needs animals each year
- GCHS has an incredible 84% placement success rate
- Helps with special cases like large-scale breeding facility seizures
- Lost and Found program reunites families with their pets
- Offers discounted spay and neuter services, plus community education
- Gives to needy families via the Pet Food Pantry
- Offers affordable adoption fees
- Has an active and involved board of directors, a dedicated and experienced shelter director and 12 part-time staff members.
- Network of supporters include veterinarians, technicians and caregivers who donate 5000+ volunteer hours a year
- 341 community members in Green and LaFayette counties
- 100+ individual animal sponsors each year
- Current fundraising efforts include Pedal for Paws Bike Relay, Paw-palooza Dinner, annual garage sales, Festival of Trees, Aluminum can collection, raffles, community events, dog and car washes, creative kids who donate presents, art and more!
